



Dear Friend of CBEC,

In 2019 CBEC will be celebrating its 40th anniversary! I find it amazing . . . all the changes that have occurred in just the past 16 years, since I stepped on the property on a cold, blustery January day. It was quiet then, no one was on site . . . *just the swans*.

Well, things have changed a lot since that cold day in 2003. There is a lot of activity on site daily, and quiet days are few and far between. But, that's a good thing. People are taking advantage of CBEC's unique property whether they are engaged in a program or activity, doing a volunteer service, walking the dog or birding along the trails. CBEC is here for "people and wildlife use." *By the way, the swans are still here along with 21 other species of waterfowl!*

So, what happened in 2018? In a nutshell:

- CBEC provided **428 programs and activities** for the general public and school students throughout 2018.
- **8,000 students** engaged in environmental education activities as part of the school curriculum.
- **785 adults** participated in programs and activities focusing on environmental stewardship.
- CBEC staff attended **27 calls/site visits** from residents with environmental issues at their homes, ranging from an osprey nest blocking the chimney to "bats in the belfry".
- Speaking of animals, the staff **rescued 48 wildlife individuals** that were in distress and/or injured and delivered them to a veterinary service or maintained them through release.

- CBEC negotiated a **partnership with two commercial entities** for an ongoing oyster restoration project.
- CBEC initiated an **ACA Kayak Safety/Rescue and Introduction to Kayaking** course for individual skill assessment.
- The **property was enhanced/improved** through several Eagle Scout projects including renovation of several blinds on the property and a new observation platform overlooking Lake Knapp
- **1263 “friends of CBEC”** attended/supported 10 fundraisers throughout 2018.
- CBEC’s **facility was used at least 100 times** in 2018 by civic organizations, state agencies, businesses, non-profit organizations and individuals for meetings and get-togethers.
- Summer Camp, over a 10-week period, **engaged 348 children** in outdoor activities.

So, what is the outlook for 2019? Continued services including some new programs and activities, more partnerships and enhanced facilities are on the docket. We just completed a Five-Year Strategic Plan that will serve as direction for Chesapeake Bay Environmental Center. A Business Plan is in the draft stage and restructuring with an eye on cost efficiency is in the works. These steps will only strengthen the organization for the future.
